



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

Note: This ethics policy is offered only as a notice. To fully comprehend the ethics environment, researchers must commit to relationships, ceremony, and protocol within the institution and community which will provide the interpretation. The academy has come to our lands, and now it is time to teach the academy how to be in our lands. Prior to submitting a research proposal, researchers will be required to engage in dialogue on research ethics with the Research Ethics Board and the Faculty to demonstrate their understanding of the natural laws and teachings which guide miyo iyiniw pimâtisiwin.
